During these sessions the children will use talk for writing strategies to explore setting, descriptions using senses, alliteration and similes and much more. This will be followed by creating persuasive leaflets about Pembrokeshire.

Daily Read Write Inc sessions will continue to support our phonological awareness and help develop our reading skills.

We will be continuing to develop the children's Welsh skills through daily 'Slot Drillio' sessions and the Fflic a Fflac continuum of work. We will be describing and identifying ourselves using the following patterns to talk about brother and sisters, pets and body parts to talk about illnesses.

Religious Education

The pupils will be taught Come and See themes based on the Church, Sacrament and Christian living. The children will explore the following topics and big questions:

- · Books- Why do we need books?

Our virtues this term will be 'Grateful & Generous' and 'Attentive & Discerning'.

Maths and Numeracy

This term, we will be focusing on building on children's understanding of addition and subtraction, using place value to support their calculations. From there, we will move on to introducing simple multiplication and division concepts, through lots of hands on, practical activities. Additionally, through our topic work, the children will have opportunities to develop important measuring skills, including length, weight, and capacity.

<u>Topic</u>

We will be exploring this topic across all areas of learning; expressive arts, science and technology, humanities, and health and wellbeing. The teaching will support the development of literacy, numeracy and digital skills.

Throughout this topic, the children will be at the centre of their learning in planning what they would like to find out. We will be continuing our links with a school in China where we learn about their culture and school life. In return, we will be promoting life in Pembrokeshire and what it is like to live in Wales.
